Planning support and services to respond to the social, emotional and mental health needs that became evident and powerful for our students during the pandemic began during the SY 20-21. Our Licensed Certified Social Worker (LCSW) is developing a schedule to devote more time and training to staff and families to respond both to the needs of our students and their families. Two Masters level social work interns are assisting the LCSW in working with students and training of staff. Planned trauma training for staff will be conducted throughout the school year.
